## Its Founder.

The winery's innovative spirit goes back to 1880, when Mr. Miguel Escorihuela Gascón sailed to Argentina from Aragón, Spain, at 19 years of age. Four years later, resourceful Don Miguel managed to purchase 42 acres of land, plant vineyards and build a winery.

The extraordinary success of his establishment allowed Don Miguel to pursue other aims. In 1920, Don Miguel ordered the construction of the highest building in Mendoza, in a place considered the highest seismic activity spot in town. When the nine-story building built with vitraux imported from France was inaugurated in 1926, Don Miguel had to pay people to live in it. One year later, a strong earthquake destroyed many nearby houses but Don Miguel's building remained intact.

Don Miguel and his relatives have become well-known in Argentina, not just because of their extraordinary wines but also because of their exceptional works - such as the construction of the new hospital that would be at the same level of the best hospitals in Europe: the renowned "Hospital Español" in Mendoza.

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## Argentina Industry.

The first Argentine vineyards were planted by Spanish conquerors who had just arrived in 1554. While these first vineyards were planted to the north of Santiago del Estero, it was the movement of the Spaniards to Mendoza and San Juan which marked the real birth of the winemaking industry in Argentina. Due to the excellent climate conditions in these two regions, the new wine industry grew rapidly and soon Argentine wine was opening its way into the market. Spain, afraid that its own monopoly production of wine might be endangered, tried to curb the Argentine wine production through taxes on crops and restrictions on production. Unfortunately for the Spanish government, they had come up against these first producers of wine who, by means of clandestine activities, continued to provide wine to most of South America.

The next milestone for the Argentine wine industry took place by mid-19th century, when new Italian and Spanish immigrants arrived, significantly increasing the growing of grapes by means of new irrigation systems. It was in 1853 when the growth of wine in Argentina made its next significant leap, with the creation of the first Agricultural School, "Quinta Normal" in Mendoza. In charge of this new school, Mr. Miguel Pouget, a Frenchman appointed by the Argentine government, was sent to train true technicians in agronomy and industrial management. With his knowledge of European traditions, Pouget developed modern farming techniques and imported a certain number of noble varieties from Europe.

By late 19th century, with the appearance of new irrigation systems (a massive network of channels that distribute water from the Andes to the thirsty soils of vineyards in the piedmont and valley) and the arrival of the first road network in Mendoza, the relatively young wine industry of Argentina was well on its way to becoming one of the most important producers in the world.

In 1884, Mr. Miguel Escorihuela Gascón founded the Escorihuela Gascón winery. During this century, Don Miguel and his family made their winery one of the most influential ones in Argentina. In 1992, a group of investors acquired their majority interests. Following the tradition of its adventurous and passionate founder, the winery has become a mecca of experimentation.

Lately, many Argentine wine producers have caught the attention of wine lovers around the world. Escorihuela Gascón, with its devotion to quality and experimentation, and promoting the role of wine as an integral part of Argentine culture, has become one of the leading wineries in the revolution of Argentine wine.
